

# Hot Dog & Soda Cheat Sheet

July 4th fairs, county festivals, and summer nights — prices climb fast. This cheat sheet stretches a \$5 bill at the gate and points you to plays that earn \$5 from your phone.

## 12 Ways to Stretch a \$5 Bill at the Fair

- Split a combo — water instead of soda saves \$2–3 at most fairs.
- Eat a real meal before you go — midway markup is brutal.
- Share a plate — half portions, full experience with a friend.
- Hit vendor row last — some prices soften near closing.
- Bring one sealed snack from home where allowed.
- Skip the game booth loop until you've walked the full fair once.
- Cash only in one envelope — when it's empty, food stops.
- Free stages and demos — entertainment without ticket add-ons.
- Compare lemonade vs. water cart — often 3x price difference.
- Kids eat smaller portions — ask for a 'snack size' if available.
- Parking farther out saves \$5–15 at big venues — walk in.
- Check for military, senior, or early-bird gate discounts online first.

## 7 Ways to Make \$5 Online Today

Stuck on the couch after the fair? Run one of these tonight (full steps in the Economy Saver Kit):

- 1 Micro-task site — 3 tasks, cash out at \$5 minimum.
- 2 One \$5 odd job post on Nextdoor or Facebook.
- 3 Five AI captions for a local shop — \$5 flat.
- 4 One printable on Etsy or Gumroad for \$5.
- 5 Two legit surveys to combined payout threshold.
- 6 One Fiverr micro-gig live tonight.
- 7 One closet flip listed with 4 photos before bed.

## Fair Math & Next Step

### The \$5 fair equation

Hot dog + soda combo often runs \$12–18. Two people sharing + water from home can cut that to \$6–8. The other half of the equation: earn the \$5 before you go so the fair doesn't eat tomorrow's gas money.
